WHAT IF WE JUST CAUGHT A GLIMPSE?

Construction Services isn't just about the cabins framed up in Alaska last July by a team of volunteers. It's not just about the repaired plumbing and the new paint on the walls of a missionary home for Society of Indian Missions in South Dakota in April. Neither is it about the new roofs in Grand Bahama, or the drywalled interiors of mission schools and churches. If we could catch a glimpse of the ripple effect of the results of work teams for missions, we would want to pull the curtain back and see a little further!

It might seem like all a volunteer is doing is milling logs and pounding nails for an Alaskan youth camp, but what about when the missionary leaves the work site to comfort a man who lost his wife a few weeks earlier? The work team may have no idea how their work freed the missionary to help a sorrowing man find relief and decide it's still worth it to come back to church where God's presence and loving relationships can heal his heart. What about the relationships forged when those same work volunteers participate in softball games with local Alaskan youth some evenings? The local youth win against the Lower 48 work team, and the excited youth decide to come to youth camps each year. One or more of the youth gets saved. They start to live for God, saying no to alcohol and drugs and sin. That youth goes to Bible College or gets a job and attends church, beginning a Christian family. Wow! We didn't know that setting trusses and nailing floor boards would result in someone's salvation and a Christian family established!

It might seem like all a volunteer is doing is spray-painting the walls of a run-down house for new missionaries on a Native American reservation on a sweaty day. But what if the hot wind blew the curtain aside for a bit and we could see beyond those work days? What if we could see the smiles on the face of the overworked president of Society of Indian Missions and know how he was encouraged to stick with his never-ending responsibilities because someone cared and simply came to help? What if we knew that the new missionaries who came to that newly-painted house would be instrumental in helping half a dozen native Americans and one white neighbor come to faith in Christ? What if the local bar went out of business because so few people were patronizing it? What if someone who was struggling with addiction to gambling was enabled to quit because the new

missionaries in the community loved them and provided Bible studies and game nights so they wouldn't be tempted to go to the arcades?

What if someone on the work team saw first hand the desperate need for vocational missionaries to reach out to the unsaved, whether through a school system or a local job, and decided to move to that state, reservation, or country as a missionary himself? What if the team members saw the financial needs and went home to work hard and send a generous offering to the struggling missionaries so they could purchase food, crafts, and prizes for outreach, and then some children or adults gave their hearts to Jesus? What if just one those children kept loving Jesus and became a missionary to his own people?

What if we could glimpse the "something beautiful, something good" that God could do as a result of our sweaty, mosquito-bitten work with our hands in construction services? If you could catch that glimpse with us, what would be something you could do?



The story behind this Servant

This year we want to pull back the curtain and show a glimpse of how Mission Helps' services have impacted the Kingdom of God. What If She Hadn't Ordered the CAT Scan?

The missionary mother washing dishes at the cement sink smiled contentedly as her children raced around the corner of the house, their ever-present puppy leaping and yipping as the three youngsters scrambled up a tree whose low-slung branches so invitingly begged to be climbed. For probably the hundredth time, she sent up a quick, heartfelt prayer of gratitude. "Thank you, Lord, that Ruthie is able to keep up with her brothers again. I'm so grateful that You had just the right person there when we needed her so desperately but didn't even realize it." Her mind flitted back nearly four years and she shuddered again at the memory of how pale Ryan looked as he burst into the kitchen and blurted, "Mom!

You gotta hurry! Ruthie's hurt bad!" She would never forget the panic that had grabbed her as she ran after Ryan and first caught sight of her little daughter's unconscious form lying so still, face down in the dust.

"Loving God, how merciful You were to allow that tumble off the bike," she breathed, although the thought of Ryan's miserable, tear-streaked face still tugged at her heart. Giving his little sister a ride on the handlebars had seemed like such a fun idea . . . until a too-quick turn pitched her head-first onto the path. The doctor at their small local clinic had been reassuring after his exam. "Still, it wouldn't hurt to message one of the Mission Helps medical volunteers," she remembered thinking.



The volunteer had been adamant that Ruthie needed a CAT scan of her head. "An x-ray can't show if there is damage to the brain itself," she told them. "I know where you can get it done." The referral had proven to be exactly what was needed, but not in a way that anyone could have anticipated as they bumped and twisted over the rocky dirt road toward the pediatric hospital they hadn't even known existed. Now, several surgeries later, Ruthie had recovered well, though not from any serious consequences from her fall. The problem that "coincidentally" showed up on the CAT scan was one that they would never have known about in time

for treatment had God not permitted the accident that led to its discovery.

What if there had been no one to give Ruthie's parents that advice? How might things have been different, not just for Ruthie, but also for many other missionaries who have been blessed by a medical provider with a servant's heart, willing to offer expert guidance on precisely

what treatment is needed for this serious case of Covid, that badly infected sore, or the other persistent high blood pressure? What about the significant financial savings as well, through reduced or no-cost lab tests and blood work provided to missionaries in the states on furlough? From Ukraine to Haiti, from India to Mexico and countries between, God is using our Medical Services team to help keep His laborers healthy and in the harvest fields so they can continue to reach a lost, hurting world with the message of hope and healing.

Tech Services and the glimpse...

When a missionary needs a laptop, Tech Services serves can order the laptop, make sure it works properly, update it, and ship it to the missionary.

The computer becomes a valuable piece of equipment for the missionary. Schooling, banking, creating spreadsheets and powerpoints, posting media for their missions organization, and keeping people informed of their ministry are just some of the ways the laptop serves their needs.

At times a person may wonder what type of impact Tech Services has on the Kingdom. One important aspect is keeping those "back home" informed. This is vital in order for the body of Christ to work together in reaching the world with the gospel. Computers play a large role in connecting missionaries and their supporters. Schooling for the children is often a great concern for missionaries as well. These computers can be a blessing to the whole education process, aiding the missionaries in the important task of educating their children. Each weight that can be lifted from the missionary frees their time for other endeavors.

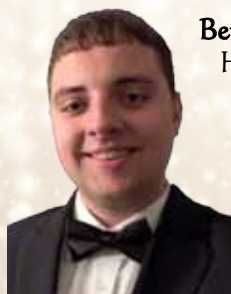

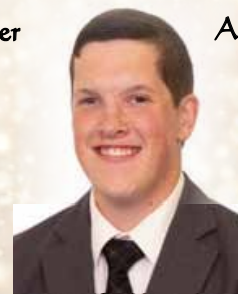
