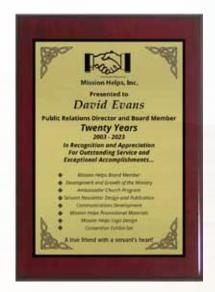
A Meartfelt Thank You

Even the comfortable van can sometimes monotobecome nous on long trips. That's when the dozens of children's stories on a MH thumb drive provides an enjoyable diversion for MK's.

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Using the lodging directory, they are able to stay overnight in different homes along their journey- homes of

MH volunteers who have the gift of hospitality.

Deputation services are enhanced by their ability to share pictures with the whole congregation using the

MH projector and screen, helping the church see the work and catch the vision for their field of labor.

After many miles of travel, the van needs serviced. They are able to locate a MH mechanic and have it serviced for a great price.

Another way riders can spend their hours on the road is to enjoy reading on the MH Kindle that contains a mission-specific library on it.

After returning home, spiritual battles arise that cause stress and concern. The missionaries reach out to Olive Asbury and ask for prayer. Reinforcement comes from the States as an army of Ropeholders daily take the needs to God and help fight their battles through the place of prayer.

As their time draws near to return to their field of ministry, they are seen by a MH medical professional and have their required physicals done for a fraction of the regular cost.





Another battle rages and the missionaries press on. They are greatly encouraged by a packet that arrives in the mail. There are some uplifting sermons and music on CD's and a letter from MH that boost their spirits and encourage them to continue in the ministry.

God blesses their ministry, and the missionaries feel the need for expansion. They contact MH and a volunteer team of construction workers take off work, pay their own way, and come help build, upgrade, repair, or expand for the cause of Christ.

The time arrives for them to back home to their field of ministry. A friendly MH volunteer meets them to pick up the MH van, and all the other loaner items. MH provides them with another night's lodging at a motel with shuttle service to the airport.

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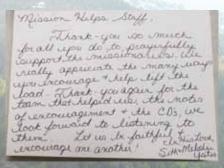
